ANALYZE THE SOURCE

Closely read the following excerpt from *Federalist No.62* (written by James Madison) and be prepared to discuss the questions that follow:

In another point of view, great injury results from an unstable government. The want of confidence in the public councils damps every useful undertaking, the success and profit of which may depend on a continuance of existing arrangements. What prudent merchant will hazard his fortunes in any new branch of commerce when he knows not but that his plans may be rendered unlawful before they can be

executed? What farmer or manufacturer will lay himself out for the encouragement given to any particular cultivation or establishment, when he can have no assurance that his preparatory labors and advances will not render him a victim to an inconstant government? In a word, no great improvement or laudable enterprise can go forward which requires the auspices of a steady system of national policy.

- 1. What are some of the "great injuries" that might result from unstable government?
- 2. What factors or events could trigger a "want of confidence in our political institutions"? What might be some of the economic consequences of this lack of confidence?
- 3. How can "an inconstant government" limit economic expansion? Are there any historical or contemporary examples of such limitations? Are there any historical or contemporary examples of a "constant" government promoting economic activity?
- 4. What should be the key elements of a "steady system of national policy" to economic enterprise? Are these elements present in contemporary national economic policy?

EXPLORE THE ESSAY

Thoughtfully read the essay, *Money, is With Propriety, Considered as the Vital Principle of the Body Politic: The* Federalist Papers *and Economic Freedom*, and be prepared to discuss the following questions:

- 1. Paraphrase the thesis of this essay.
- 2. What were four or five significant economic problems in America under the Articles of Confederation?
- 3. In the 1780s, what were the three main obstacles to economic freedom?
- 4. How can a strong central government promote free and open competition? How can such a government inhibit competition? Have there been times in American history where the government has either promoted or inhibited economic competition?
- 5. Without a strong central government, how could individual states impede competition and free enterprise?
- 6. How can the unequal distribution of property enable people to oppress each other?
- 7. How does Madison propose to control factions? Is republican government a sufficient curb on factions? If not, what else is needed?
- 8. Which specific tools does the Constitution give to the federal government to support commerce?
- 9. How does the system of checks and balances protect economic rights? Are there examples from American history when this system has worked? when it hasn't worked?
- 10. In addition to the general structural supports in the Constitution to protect economic liberty, there are numerous specific provisions (some referenced in this essay) to ensure economic freedom. Which three or four of the provisions below do you think play the greatest role in guaranteeing economic freedom? Why?

 - Patents
 - Weights and measures
 - Commerce clause
 - ▶ Impediments to contracts
 - Coining and counterfeiting
 - Payment of national debt
